To conserve wildlife of India through education and research by involving government agencies as well as local communities and providing healthcare to distressed wildlife.







RESEARCH


- Research in wildlife medicine and zoonotic diseases.



vultures.



2 GREEN WARRIORS: Capacity building

3 VETS FOR WILD: Capacity building of
veterinarians for rescue and rehabilitation of
wild fauna, first aid, post operative care and
management of wildlife, chemical
immobilization, post mortem and forensic
investigations etc.


3000+ Veterinarians trained so far.

We hosted Nagpur bird race, an annual event consecutively for five years, to generate interest about birds among the citizens.




6 WILDLIFE LAW ENFORCEMENT:

Strengthening frontline staff to investigate the wildlife related cases using forensic techniques.

2900+ Frontline staff of the forest department trained so far.



7 ONE HEALTH: We are focused on the research in wildlife biology, disease ecology in free ranging and captive wildlife and its control, wildlife health surveillance and Wildlife Disease Risk Analysis (WDRA).



10600+ Animals vaccinated

Completed 'Caprological Survey for wildlife health management in and around Melghat Tiger Reserve, Maharashtra'.

Research on wildlife disease ecology.

Regular immunization of domestic animals against diseases that can be transmitted to and from domestic animals to wild animals.

20 research papers, 50 presentations in national conferences and 30 presentations in international conferences.

8 WILD RESCUE: Rescue and rehabilitation of wild animals in distress, providing veterinary services and post-operative care and management.

26000+ Animals were given veterinary support.



9 FROM CONFLICT TO COEXISTENCE:

Dealing man-wildlife conflict and its mitigation with the help of frontline staff, veterinarians and local communities in conflict area.

- Capacity building of frontline staff of forest department, veterinarians and NGO's involved in the rescue and rehabilitation of wild animals to deal wildlife emergencies including conflict and natural disasters etc.



- Formation of Rapid Response Team at Navegaon Nagzira Tiger reserve and providing skill development training to the team members

10 WILD LAND: Habitat conservation for conservation of endangered species and its recovery.

Inputs in Tiger Conservation Plan of Navegaon Nagzira Tiger Reserve, Maharashtra for landscape management.




11 GREEN LIVELIHOOD: Providing alternative livelihood and training to the local communities to reduce their dependency on the forest and forest products.



12 GREEN CORRIDOR:


Corridor conservation through tree plantation, sensitization of local stakeholders including villagers and school children.




TARGET AUDIENCE



